To All The Saints,

Today as I write this last message of the year to you, it is the first day of winter, the shortest day of the year, and the celebration of Christmas just five days away. At this point in time you have undoubtedly heard it said, and have probably said it too, "where has the time gone?" It's hard to believe, but it's true, another year is nearly history. Soon all the wishes that have been proffered for a "Merry Christmas" will be replaced with those for a "Happy New Year".

THE PRESIDENT'S CORNER by Gil Vatter

This will be my final "President's Corner". A new Congregation Council president will be elected at the regular February meeting who will replace me, as the church's by-laws require. Because of circumstances, I will have served as president for almost thirty months and I will have completed my third year as a member of the Council, as well. I will not be running for reelection to the Council.

Since this is my last "Corner", I want to take advantage of this column to make some personal observations, while I have this soap box from which to speak.

First of all, being president of this congregation, under the circumstances in which it happened, has been difficult and time consuming. At the same time, being at the forefront of the action which marked the turnaround of the parish has been exciting and satisfying. I will miss the day-to-day activity which makes up the life of Good Shepherd, but I will also be relieved to surrender the responsibility and hard work being president demands, to someone else.

To be sure, the early days were dismal and challenging. The fiscal outlook was bleak, many of the core families were no longer in the parish, there was no clergyperson to turn to for advice and assistance and several of the members of the Council had resigned and left the church, including the president. Some people expected the church to close. There was nowhere to go but up.

Still, there were enough people determined to preserve Good Shepherd as a viable church to make the attempt to go on worth trying, so, as the obvious first step, the six remaining members of the Council met (Michael Carp, Andy Mathisen, Lou Medici, Karl Torjussen, Garry Westerweller and me), to decide what we had on the "credit" side of our ledger and what we could do about the "debit" side. Decisions were made to reorganize the Council, bring new members on board and make sure that every activity in the life of the church was operating and under needed supervision.

Those activities functioning as before, the Altar Guild, the choir, the ushers, the lay readers, were assigned to the supervision of a Council Committee and left to continue operating, while those areas which needed attention were studied and modified. A part-time pastor, Rev. Ed Schmidt, was sent to the church by the Bishop of the Synod to replace weekly substitute preachers and we were able to turn over clergy responsibilities to him and also use his experience to help us plan the next step.

We continued a financial balancing act through the summer and into the fall while adding three new members to the Council (Steve Miller, Sharon Oberkehr and Tom Tehve) and two new committee chairs, not members of the Council (Debbie Blackburn and Clem Hergenhan). In July, Pat Dunn became church secretary, filling one big opening and Pat Miller became Treasurer replacing Dick Alberti who had served for several years and wanted to retire. Since then, three more people have joined the Council (John Crump, Lil Nemeik and Amanda Westerweller) and one more person has become chair of a committee without becoming a Council member (Liz Westerweller).

The next two years saw organization take hold, activity increase in the life of the church, finances improve and a spirit of family and fellowship return to the congregation. It quickly became a pleasure to come to worship

I am very proud of this congregation and its elected officials and so pleased with what we have achieved in the past two and a half years. The church is buzzing with life and spirit and the outlook for the future is positive. We have been blessed with both lay and clerical leadership and with God's help we will move forward and continue to fulfill our mission in this place.

My thanks to all who stepped forward to do what had to be done in 2008 and to those who found a spark worth preserving, renewing and improving for the future of the Lutheran Church of the Good Shepherd.

More than 125 people gathered at two services on Christmas Eve to celebrate the birth of the Savior. A creche greeted the worshipers as they entered the church and the sanctuary was adorned with seasonal wreathes and flowers, beautifully arranged by the Altar Guild. A sea of thirty red poinsettias, offered by families from the parish, covered the altar and a tall decorated Christmas tree was placed at the front of the church.

The 4:00 pm "Family Service" opened with an organ prelude by Miae Park, "It Came Upon the Midnight Clear", and included favorite carols such as "O Come, All Ye Faithful" and "The First Noel", as well as the familiar Biblical prophesy from Isaiah and the Christmas story from the second chapter of Saint Luke. Pastor Elstad spoke about the miracle of the Incarnation and, following the holy communion, the congregation sang "Silent Night" and "Joy to the World". The organ postlude was "In Dulci Jubilo" by Gilbert M. Martin.

At the 10:00 pm "Candlelight Service", the choir added a prelude. "Let Our Gladness Know No End" by L. Claude D'Aquin and an anthem, "Candlelight Carol" by John Rutter and, following the sermon and communion, the service was again ended with the dimming of the lights, the lighting of individual candles and the singing of the well known strains of "Silent Night". Rachel Mathisen played "Christmas Melody", arranged by Christine Anderson, on the handbells as the postlude to the late service.
